

Go over these guidelines with your class:

- 1. Ensure your name is on the front page.
- 2. These sheets are to last for the duration of Ramadhan activities.
- 3. At the end of the lesson this is to be collected and placed on a shelf for the next day. They are to be taken home when Ramadhan activities end.
- 4. No scribbling pupils must write neatly and clearly. Take pride in your work.

- 6. Read, understand and then answer questions. Your teacher will explain anything you do not understand.
- 7. All colouring to be done neatly. No felt tips to be used.

Mashq of Ramadhan Duas

Note: Collective practice (Mashq) of the following Duas must be carried out at the beginning of each lesson for at least 5 minutes.

At sunset time, BEFORE you eat, read the following Dua:

Breaking Fast ٱللَّهُمَّ لَكَ صُمْتُ وَ عَلَى بِ زُقِكَ ٱفْطَرْتُ.

(Abu Dawood)

Oh Allah I fasted only for you.

And with your food I break my fast.

After you have eaten a bit of food, recite this Dua:

ذَهَبَ الظَّمَأُ وَابُتَلَّتِ الْعُرُونُ وَ ثَبَتَ الْآجُرُ إِنْ شَاءَ اللهُ.

Thirst has vanished.

Veins have become moistened.

Allah willing, the Reward (for the fast) has been established.

A special Dua

On the authority of Anas (may Allah be pleased with him): The Messenger of Allah (), used to say the following when the month of Rajab began.

Oh Allah!
Bless us in Rajab and Sha`ban, and bring us, oh Allah, to Ramadan.

[Narrated by Tabarani and Ahmad]

- > Learn this Dua by heart.
- > Read it, as we are in the month of Sha'ban. Read it after every Salaah.
- > Next year, recite this Dua from the month of Rajab. This will be from around 12th May 2013.
- > The best time to recite this Dua is after every Fardh Salaah.

Note:

Carry out collective Mashq of this Dua in every lesson.

- ✓ Ramadhan is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar.
- ✓ It is the month when Muslims fast.
- ✓ We "break" our fast when the sun sets.
- ✓ Fasting is one of the 5 pillars of Islam.
- ✓ Ramadhan teaches us many things, such as thinking of the poor and those who do not get food to eat everyday, gaining Taqwa, getting closer to Allah etc.
- ✓ Ramadhan can also bring the Ummah (community) together, both locally and across the world. Can you think of how?
- ✓ Ramadhan is a very important part of every Muslim's life.
- ✓ Ramadhan is the month of giving and mercy: during this month Allah blesses the believers with forgiveness and great reward.
- ✓ Ponder over the following Hadith:

"When Ramadhan comes, the doors of Heaven are opened and the doors of Hell are closed, and the Devils are put in chains – and the doors of Mercy are opened."



<u>Learning about Ramadhan</u>

The Month of Ramadan and Fasting

The reason why Ramadhan is important because:

- 1. The Holy Quran was revealed in this month.
- 2. Fasting, which is one of the five pillars of Islam, is during this month.
- 3. Ramadhan is the month of patience and tolerance.
- 4. Ramadhan is the month in where we feed the hungry, help the poor and look after the needy.
- 5. Ramadhan is the month of giving alms and charity and completing the recitation of the Quran.
- 6. The Night of Power, which is considered to be sacred more than a thousand months, is also in the month of Ramadhan.
- 7. Fasting during Ramadhan is one of the five pillars of Islam.
- 8. Fasting is obligatory for all those men and women who are conscious and above the age of maturity.

10. The elderly, the sick and the traveller are excused of fasting; they will make up for the missed fasts later.

It is narrated that Ramadhan is divided into three:

- 1. The beginning is mercy.
- 2. The middle is blessing.
- 3. The end is the rescue from the wrath of Hell.

Learning about Ramadhan

Taraweeh Prayers

- > Special prayers are said each evening in this holy month.
- > Special evening prayers are conducted during which portions of the Quran are recited. These special prayers are known as Taraweeh.
- > The word Taraweeh comes from an Arabic word which means to rest and relax.
- > After each four rakats, one sits for a brief period of rest before continuing.
- > The Quran is divided into equal parts (called juz) for the purpose of reading sections of equal length during each of the nights of Ramadan. By the end of the month the entire Quran has been completed.
- > It is recommended that Muslims attend the Taraweeh prayers in the Masjid (after 'Isha, the last evening prayer), to pray in congregation.
- > These prayers are voluntary, but are strongly recommended and widely practiced.
- > A person who has memorised the Quran (known as a Hafiz) usually leads the Taraweeh prayer. Do you know anybody who is a Hafiz?



The Night of Power!!!

Allah says in the Quran:

"The night of power is greater than a thousand months".

- ⇒ In the last ten days of Ramadhan, there is a VERY special night. Worshipping Allah on this night will get you the reward of OVER A 1000 months. That is OVER 83 years of worship!
- ⇒ Just imagine: You can get the reward of worshiping Allah for 83 years in just ONE night.
- ⇒ Nobody knows when EXACTLY this night is. All we know is that this night comes in the ODD nights of the last TEN days of Ramadhan.
- \Rightarrow The ODD nights are:

21 st 23 rd	25 th	27 th	29 th
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
⇒ On these FIVE nights, we must make special effort to worship Allah. By making just a little effort, we can gain a lot of reward very quickly. Besides reading the Quran, Salaah and Dhikr, we should make lots of Dua on this night.
